- * If an uncompleted undergraduate program, applicants with:
- 1-7 tertiary subjects (10-70 credit points) in an undergraduate program are assessed on high school scores only.
 - 8-11 tertiary subjects (80-110 credit points) are assessed on a combination (50% / 50%) tertiary studies and high school scores.
 - 12 or more subjects (120+ credit points) towards any UG program (meeting the grade requirements, pre-requisites and UMAT) are assessed on UG studies only as 'stand-alone' (i.e. without high school scores taken into account).
- *** If the most recent tertiary qualification is older than nine years, as at the application deadline, it will not be counted towards assessment. Applicants must complete a minimum qualification of postgraduate diploma (i.e. at least eight postgraduate subjects or equivalent in any discipline). Applicants must also ensure that the Chemistry and Maths B prerequisites are satisfied within the nine year rule. Research and thesis based qualifications are not eligible.

ALL applications are through QTAC website only and not through the Bond website. Faculty interviews will be held mid February 2012 (on campus only). Offers made for Round 1 from mid March 2012 (with short acceptance period of 7-14 days). In 2011, almost 535 applications were received; approximately 190 interviews held and 85 places awarded. In 2012 we will offer approximately 85 places, 80 per cent non degree holders, 20 per cent graduates.
Program fees	<p>For 2012 entry:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> \$293,188 for the full program. Payment of \$41,884 (one year in advance) is required for the first year, with \$20,942 payable per semester after the first year. <p>Fees are subject to change each year. Refer to www.bond.edu.au for current fees. FEE-HELP (for Australian citizens only) is approximately \$106,328. Please refer to www.goingtouni.gov.au for further information about finance assistance.</p>
